Your messy brain dump contains the authentic insights, personal experience, quirky phrasing and unique perspective that no AI can generate. This becomes the foundation that ensures everything that follows sounds like you.

### The Deep Research Enhancement Process

## Step 1: Transform Your Brain Dump into Research Questions

You can take your messy thoughts and use AI to help you identify what you need to research. This is about spotting gaps in your knowledge and angles you might have missed.

### Prompt Template:

Based on this brain dump about what I'm trying to write: [paste your unstructured thoughts within the brackets]

Help me identify:

- What additional research would strengthen my understanding
- What perspectives or data I might be missing
- What questions I should be asking that I'm not asking yet
- How to structure this into an effective deep research prompt

Focus on research that builds on my existing expertise rather than replacing it.

## Step 2: Deep Research Mode - Your AI Research Team

*You should have a prompt to run from step 1 above, or if not you get another shot with the prompt below!*

**Top tip:** Run deep research in multiple AI models. ChatGPT and Gemini are particularly strong for this, but Claude's research capabilities are also excellent.

### Deep Research Prompt Template:

Target audience: [who will read this]

Please provide a comprehensive research report with sources, covering multiple angles and practical insights I can use.

## Step 3: The Magic Synthesis Conversation

**This is where most people stop too soon, but it's where the real magic happens.**

Take your research report (or several, run it in at least two separate models) and feed it into a fresh chat. Make sure you're using an advanced model:

- **ChatGPT:** Change from 4o to o3 (yes, weird numbering!)
- **Claude:** Use Claude 4 (default on paid plans)
- **Gemini:** Use 2.5 Pro (default on paid plans)

### Synthesis Prompt Template:

I've conducted research on [topic] and received this comprehensive report: [paste or attach research report]

Now I want to have an intelligent conversation about what this means for my specific situation:

My context: [your circumstances, constraints, opportunities]

My values: [what's important to you/your organisation]

My voice: [your communication style and brand personality]
